# Day 2 Forum Wednesday 19th September

The forum will be opened by The Hon. Gavin Jennings MLC, Minister for Aboriginal Affairs.

MC – Shane Charles, Community Agent, Business Governance Training, Indigenous Unit, Swinburne TAFE.

#### **Keynote Address**

Paul Briggs, Inaugural Sir Douglas Nicholls Fellow and founder of Rumbalara Football and Netball Club.

This will be followed by a series of action-oriented workshops pointing to the development of a regional agreement.

#### Workshops

There will be a series of concurrent workshops structured in a way that will enable attendees to participate in several different workshops during the day.

Facilitator – Jodie Ryan, Director of Ingenuity Consulting, an Aboriginal owned and controlled consulting company.

Through a series of conversations beginning February 2007 the following workshops have been developed:

#### Sovereignty or "Citizenship"

Exploring the concepts surrounding the notions of sovereignty and citizenship. What do these terms mean? Is being Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander different from being an Australian citizen? What concept of citizenship will work for Australia's first nation people, settlers and migrants?

# Governance and the New Representative Arrangements

Explores new representative arrangements post-ATSIC in Victoria. What are the critical elements for Indigenous people in developing a representative structure? What might a model for the region look like? How will it work for Indigenous people?

#### Respect/Authority

Respect and authority arises from recognition of diversity within local Indigenous communities, of honouring Indigenous survival and the re-creation of identity. How do we in the Eastern Metropolitan Region contribute to the recognition and growth of Indigenous presence? How do we honour Indigenous authority?

#### Identity

Oodgeroo Noonuccal wrote that colonial culture came promoting identity as having and doing, whereas Indigenous identity is about being and belonging. This workshop will explore these differences with a view to healing the attitudes of the past. As Indigenous people how do we maintain and reinforce our own distinct cultural identity? How does the non-Indigenous community promote and support Indigenous people in the pursuit of their cultural identity?

#### Health/Well-Being

Life expectancy for Indigenous people in New Zealand, Canada and the USA is 5 years less than the non-Indigenous community – in Australia it's 17 years. How do we close this unacceptable gap? This workshop examines innovative service models for engagement between health providers and the Indigenous community.

#### Justice

Outlining the current challenges for Indigenous people and their interaction with the justice system, this workshop will explore what needs to occur in the region to support better outcomes. How can non-Indigenous organisations support this?

#### Koorie Education, Training and Employment Pathways

There are over 500 Indigenous students in primary and secondary schools in the Eastern region. What are their needs and aspirations? What are the needs and aspirations of other members of the Indigenous community? What works well? How can better outcomes be supported?

#### Indigenous Business Development

Identifies some successful models for Indigenous business development. What are the gaps? How can the business sector support employment and the growth of Indigenous business development in the region?
